



Appointment of Chief Executive Officer

(19 November 2024) The Estate Agents Authority (“EAA”) announces today that Ms Ruby HON Yuen-ping, the incumbent Chief Executive Officer (“CEO”), will leave the EAA at the end of this year; and that she will be succeeded by Mr Gordon LEUNG Chung-tai.

Ms HON has served the EAA for over 19 years, including as CEO since June 2014. Ms HON said, “I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude to the EAA’s trust in me. With the unfailing support from my colleagues and stakeholders, I am delighted to see that the EAA has continuously enhanced the professional standard and integrity of the estate agency trade. I extend my best wishes to the next CEO in leading the EAA to scale new heights.”

Mr Simon SIU Chak-yu, Chairman of the EAA, said, “On behalf of the EAA, I would like to thank Ms HON for her dedication, leadership, and invaluable contributions to the EAA. I sincerely wish her all the best in her future endeavours, and take the opportunity to welcome Mr LEUNG.”

Mr LEUNG joined the Administrative Service of the Government in 1985 and worked in various Bureaux and Departments before retiring from the civil service in 2022 as Director of Social Welfare. He was selected through an open recruitment exercise and will officially take up the CEO position on 1 January 2025. “Mr LEUNG has ample experience in public administration. I am confident that he will lead the EAA and support the estate agency trade to meet the challenges ahead,” Mr SIU said.

The EAA is established under the Estate Agents Ordinance to regulate the practice of estate agency in Hong Kong, promote integrity and
