



**The EAA held an online seminar on the dos and don'ts of renting a property**

(28 September 2020) The Estate Agents Authority (“EAA”) has just held a Facebook live seminar on the dos and don'ts about the renting of residential properties over the last weekend. Three guest speakers shared their knowledge and insights on different aspects and considerations that prospective landlords and tenants should take note of before entering into a tenancy agreement. The seminar was hosted by Ms Grace Lam, News Controller of Metro Finance. Guest speakers included Dr Chan Yan Chong, Adjunct Professor of City University of Hong Kong, Mr George Cheung, of Counsel of Eversheds Sutherland, and Mr Chan U-keng, Director of Operations of the EAA.

During the one hour seminar, the speakers shared their insights with the online audience and answered questions raised by them through the comment box. Dr Chan shared his views on the outlook of the global economy and the investment market on local properties, while Mr Cheung talked about the important details to note when entering into a tenancy agreement. Selected complaint cases were also shared by Mr Chan to explain the responsibilities of estate agents.
